### Tips for Helping a Friend Who is at Risk for Suicide

Someone recently asked me a tough, but good question. "How do you help someone who you think may be at risk for suicide?" Here is practical advice that may help to answer that question.

First, take the big leap and talk to your friend as soon as possible. You may be surprised how easy it is and how much better you feel after doing it. You don't need to have all the answers or solve the problem, just open the door to a conversation and then be willing to listen. It's not the job of the helper to have the answer or tell the person what to do, only to be willing to introduce the topic and *listen!* 

Always use "I" statements, not "you" statements. "I get concerned when I hear you talk about suicide"

not "you scare me when you talk about suicide". Ask "what" questions. Asking questions that starts with the word "what" opens up the conversation and gives you an opportunity to listen. "What do you think would help?" "What happened when...?"

Offer to find help. It's fair to say, "well I can't do that for you, but I can help you find someone who can." And then follow through to the best of your ability.





### Ready for Kindergarten? Here's How Los Niños Helps

For many children at Los Niños del Valle, Kindergarten is just around the corner. Preparing children for this important event is an ongoing process for families as well as our staff.

Beginning in January, parent/teacher conferences provide an opportunity to discuss questions and concerns about kindergarten readiness. Standardized assessments and individual portfolios are a highlight of the conference, giving parents important information about their child's development.

In February and March, dental, hearing and vision screenings are offered to address any potential areas needing further examination. While teachers prepare lesson plans focusing on literacy, science and mathematics, activities promoting social skills are given a high priority assuring a smooth transition to public school. Parents receive a packet with valuable phone numbers, checklists and helpful hints.

Visits to Sahuarita and Continental primary schools are planned in April and May to give the children visual experiences of what they can expect their first day of kindergarten.

#### Gifts of Remembrance

There are many ways for you to make a gift in remembrance of someone special that will have meaningful significance for years to come.

A memorial gift of cash or property:

With a gift of cash, you receive a tax deduction for the value of your gift to us. If you are making a memorial gift of appreciated stock or real estate, your deduction may depend on the type of property.

Make a deductible gift and receive life income: You may wish to make a memorial gift while providing current life income for yourself. If you are looking for ways to increase your income you might consider a gift annuity or unitrust for memorial gifts. Gift annuity: With a memorial gift annuity, you make a gift of cash or appreciated property in honor of someone, and we promise to pay you fixed income for life (with rates based on your age). You receive a charitable deduction for the value of your gift. The amount remaining after you pass away comes to Casa Community Services in the form of a gift in memory of your loved one.

*Unitrust:* If your memorial gift is made to fund a charitable remainder trust, you can receive income monthly, quarterly or annually. You benefit from a charitable deduction for your gift this year and avoid paying capital gains tax on the sale of your appreciated assets. The remainder passes to Casa as a gift in memory of your loved one.
