And Beyond - Residents - Employees

Sahuarita

In 2017, La Posada was invited by Sahuarita to become part of its incorporated Town. The La Posada Board and management team believe that the strategic goals of the Town of Sahuarita are well-aligned with our own in its appreciation for a diverse and multi-generational community that is able to grow and thrive. The Town leadership values what La Posada has to offer and recognizes that La Posada wishes to serve both the Green Valley and Sahuarita communities.

The La Posada Board of Trustees voted to accept the annexation invitation into Sahuarita after a

series of sessions with residents were held to ascertain their thoughts and concerns. Annexation will occur in 2018.

Oro Valley - Nakoma Sky

Site work began in 2017 and is scheduled to carry through 2018. Nakoma Sky has attracted strong interest in the Oro Valley, Rancho Vistoso and Saddlebrooke communities, and pre-leasing has been most successful. A series of events has occurred, including a groundbreaking event, which was well attended and thoroughly enjoyed by all.

La Posada's financial performance in 2017 continued in a healthy manner. We understand that financial well being is essential to resident security and sense of well being. Many years of good financial health have improved our organization's ability to hold down resident fee increases, to pursue appropriate growth opportunities, and to handle uncertainty in our housing market and regulatory environments. Our corporate parent, Posada Life, received its federal tax exemption status in June, 2017.

Our independent living homes, which range from free-standing single family structures to clustered garden homes to apartment homes, reflected an average occupancy of 88.1%, in spite of better-than-budgeted leasing results (66 contracts). Various programs have been developed to promote community awareness and to welcome those who wish to have a "trial stay." Financial workshops have been most successful in educating potential residents,









and our residents continue to be our best ambassadors.

Our Assisted Living occupancy, which includes La Joya Holmlund Apartments, La Via Memory Suites and La Hacienda enhanced care, was slightly unfavorable, but the combined net assets were favorable to budget due to control of operational expenses and then further boosted by market gains. Assisted Living occupancy has been impacted by delayed moves due to our ability to offer additional at home support services.

Our Community Services continued to serve individuals beyond La Posada's boundaries and continued to evolve with identified needs and technology advances. Our storefront activity, "Community Connect," evolved into Connect Green Valley, a consumer- friendly smart phone app (1,608 users in 2017) and directed walk-ins to visit our on-campus community center. A podcast service is being prepared to launch in 2018 and will be incorporated into our marketing and media efforts. Our grant-funded and resident donation-supported outdoor classroom is underway and anticipated to be enjoyed by Los Niños preschool children in 2018.

During 2017, work continued on Nakoma Sky, a second campus being developed to serve the Oro Valley and surrounding communities 40 miles north of Green Valley. Site work is projected to be a lengthy process due to the land topography, so while awaiting completion of construction documents and Town approvals, La Posada has used its own resources to move forward so as not to lose time. This is in recognition of the fact that Nakoma Sky is highly pre-leased, and that La Posada and line of credit site work funds expended will be reimbursed at the time of bond financing, scheduled for July/August 2018.



Funding in this interim period is being achieved by a board-approved \$16 million dollar revolving line of credit with Northern Trust Bank. This bank also hosts an escrow account containing reservation deposits from 201 families at year-end, totaling \$8.3 million. Most of Nakoma Sky expenses are being capitalized or treated as pre-paid marketing.

La Posada touches a broad spectrum of age and income levels, as reflected in these 2017 statistics:

- Independent living apartments and homes housed 709 people.
- Assisted Living housed 167 people (98% from campus).
- Outpatient Therapies treated 750 patients. (677, or 90%, were from outside the campus.)
- In addition to Outpatient Therapies, community outreach included:
 - 3,408 person days of adult care
 - 6,893 senior lunches served
 - 12,353 days of childcare
 - 561 behavioral health counseling visits
 - 27, 608 encounters in Community Connect and Community Center
 - La Posada employed an average of 635 people during the year
 - More than 8000 volunteer hours occurred at The Shoppes; a total of 79,456 Volunteer hours both on and off our campus in other endeavors.

Corporation net assets are \$3.6 million, which includes \$2.4 million of unrealized market gains. The largest unfavorable variance to budget was due to occupancy revenue (\$1.6 million), and

largest favorable variance to budget was due to realized investment income of \$1.48 million.

Monthly service fee increases for 2017 over 2016 averaged 3.03%. For 2018 over 2017, they will be 2.5% to 2.9%, depending on location. Employee health insurance and minimum wage state-mandated increases, as well as occupancy levels, were key challenges to meet projections.

Due to La Posada management strategy to hold down resident rate increases to ease pressure on current residents and improve market penetration, reserves are building at a reduced rate.





Financial projections show performance still above the average compared to accredited peers and rated nonprofit continuing care retirement communities.

Our investment strategy is one of diversification, and La Posada achieved an overall 12.6% return in 2017. We believe we are well positioned for 2018 market fluctuations, which are expected to occur.

All debt covenants with Northern Trust Bank were met or well exceeded. Debt service coverage ended the year at 2.83, well above the 1.25 covenant.






Once again, the mission and people of La Posada benefited from the generosity of La Posada's residents, employees, board and friends.







The generosity of our residents and friends of La Posada is a wonderful part of our culture of appreciation and gratitude.

This unique culture promotes the development of new programs and amenities, the sustaining of current things we need, enjoy, and value, and ways in which we care for our own, both residents, employees, and the larger community we live in. We could not do so much of what we do without resident support.

A brief summary of our Foundation activity is provided here. The available dollars do not reflect ongoing market gains and losses.

<u>General Campus Funds</u> – include support for a variety of campus activities, ranging from the butterfly garden, to the Shoppes, to Central Park, to intergenerational programs.



La Joya/La Via/La Hacienda/Therapies – This is a fund to support higher level service and care needs on our campus.



<u>Special Interests</u> – fund grouping that reflects resident support for special interests including the libraries, media services, computer club, art program, workshop, chaplaincy, arts & music, La Posada Singers, exercise equipment, etc.



<u>Good Neighbor Fund</u> – subsidizes our residents who, through no fault of their own, outlive their financial resources. Donations to the Treasure Shoppe, bequests and charitable gifts support this effort.

We have established endowment funds for the purposes of long term support, scholarship awards, assistance from the Good Neighbor Fund, support of fitness & the Pavilion, and an unrestricted fund to assist with needs not met.

The principal of Endowment Funds is restricted in perpetuity, with gains of up to 5% to be used each year to meet current needs.

All of our funds have investment gains and losses fluctuations. Investment gains may be restricted or unrestricted, based upon donor wishes. If unrestricted, a fund's gains may be used wherever most needed.

The Foundation strives to disperse all funds donated.
